Anointing of the Sick Sunday, December 2, 2018 1:30 pm (after the Noon Mass)

Anointing of the Sick is a sacrament which gives one *grace* as strengthening and *peace* and *courage* to overcome the difficulties that are associated with disease, illness and dying. The essential rite of the sacrament consists in the priest laying hands on the sick, anointing with blessed oil, and praying "*Through this holy anointing may the Lord in his love and mercy help you with the grace of the Holy Spirit. May the Lord who frees you from sin save you and raise you up.*"

Is anyone sick among you? He should summon the presbyters of the church, and they should pray over him and anoint (him) with oil in the name of the Lord, and the prayer of faith will save the sick person, and the Lord will raise him up. If he has committed any sins, he will be forgiven. (James 5: 14-16)

Gospel Reflection

If you brought your child to the restroom during the Liturgy of the Word, you might walk away with one of two interpretations of Jesus as King. The first and second readings are bold and victorious. We see Christ coming on the clouds for the final judgment of heaven and earth. The Gospel sets a very different tone. Jesus is under arrest and facing death before Pontius Pilate. We know how this story will end. So if Christ is King, what does it mean? Is he a glorious conqueror or a suffering servant?

"My kingdom does not belong to this world." Here is the heart of Jesus' reign. He is a king -- and his "subjects" are alive and well on earth -- but, ultimately, Jesus' kingdom transcends our earthly concepts of power. Jesus faced down the temptation of a solely earthly kingship. At the close of his 40 days in the desert, the devil offered him the kingdoms of the world. Jesus only had to sacrifice his heavenly values and worship Satan. The same temptations to distort the kingship of Christ are present to us today. Jesus' invitation also endures. "Everyone who belongs to the truth listens to my voice." It is important for us to belong to the full truth of Christ's kingdom.

First, our own hearts must be transformed. Our own rebellions in favor of selfishness and against holiness must be conquered by God's grace. Second, we must work to transform the world as best we can in our own corner of it. Like Jesus shows us by his life and death, this doesn't mean domination. It means service, sacrifice, respect, and love. Our lives must "testify to the truth" of Jesus Christ, who lays down his life for his people. That is the true beauty of Christ the King!

Q: In a recent homily, Monsignor Mike walked us through a process of prayer that was a little outside the familiar devotional box, taking a step just outside our liturgical comfort zone. What was it that made this prayerful process so appealingly insightful and effective?

A: Maybe what happened when we closed our eyes was that we actually brought into sharper focus what prayer can be.

The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* lists more than 100 index citations of prayer. The Monsignor's imagery touched on some of them, such as: A Prayer of Petition; A Prayer of Contemplation; A Prayer of Meditation; A Prayer of Hope; A Prayer of Love; A Prayer In the Community of Believers. A Prayer of the Word of God.

In a season of thanksgiving we are grateful for pastoral leadership that guides us in the way of prayer. We are drawn to the mystery and beauty of the kind of prayer that honors the Lord, and is charitable and forgiving to all.

That means attending Mass regularly, praying the Divine Office and the rosary, abstaining from meat on Fridays throughout the year and observing specific fast days. They also gather at least monthly for a chapter meeting and commit to ongoing faith formation.

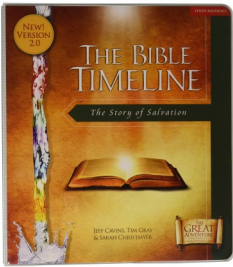

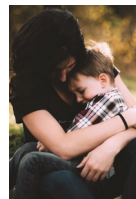
