

Rapid Response Network

Members of the St. James Social Justice Ministry (SJM) periodically contact our representatives and/or the federal government to comment on pending legislation or administrative actions that may impact segments of our society, especially those on the margins.

In one recent example members signed onto a letter from the US Conference of Catholic Bishops to the Administration, urging it to restore the Refugee Resettlement program. Issues that might be addressed include human trafficking, homelessness, immigration, environmental justice, and others.

In an effort to increase our voice, the SJM is initiating the Rapid Response Network. If the SJM becomes aware of an urgent or timely social issue, Network members will be notified by email and asked to sign a petition or send a draft letter (via host website). Participation in any notification is totally voluntary and private, and email addresses will not be used for any other purpose.

Gospel Meditation

"Some Saducees, those who deny that there is a resurrection, came forward and put this question to Jesus ..."

In this Sunday's Gospel, the Saducees avoid their real question. Is there a resurrection from the dead or not?

Rather than ask this question point blank, the Saducees try to prove their point through a roundabout, unrealistic scenario. Jesus cuts straight to the question behind the question, citing Scripture passages relating to the resurrection.

The Saducees are trying to trick Jesus.

While we may not intend to stump God, our doubts and questions may have more in common with the Saducees than we care to admit. Doubts are part and parcel of life in a fallen world. Still, there are different ways we can word our doubts to ourselves, God, and others. When we're struggling, truly struggling, about some article of faith, do we admit it? Or do we cloak it with other, obtuse questions to hide the nature of our concern?

Have you considered leaving the Church over the hypocrisy of some of her members and leaders?

Perhaps the real question is: "How can a place blessed by God and instituted by Christ have this evil in it?

Can I reconcile with the concept that an institution has an admixture of good and bad?

What do I expect from others, from myself?

What responsibility do I have to try and remedy evil in an institution I'm part of?"

Perhaps you've wondered about the nature of romantic love, and if God is love, does He really care so much about the details of this particular scenario?

Perhaps the real question is: "Can my mind wrap around the concept of a God whose law seems — on the surface, in this situation — to make people unhappy?

What is the relationship between the moral law and human flourishing?"

These aren't easy questions, but they are more honest ones. This week, don't be afraid of your deeper questions! Bring them to God, to someone you trust, and to yourself.

Catholic Q & A A Saintly Pilgrimage

- J. P. Alegria

Q: The Church calls Mary the patroness of humanity."

Believed to be the greatest of all Christian Saints, the events in her life are part of the history of salvation as foreshadowed in the Old Testament, and recorded in the New Testament, faithfully celebrated in liturgical feasts of the universal Church. What does our catechism, our Archbishop, and spiritual writer Matthew Kelly have to say about the light, the peace, and the role of Mary within God's divine plan?

A: The catechism presents Mary as wholly united with her son. "Mary's role in the Church is inseparable from her union with Christ and flows directly from it."

Archbishop Gomez wrote recently about Mary and Marian prayer such as the Rosary, (what Paul VI called, "an epitome of the whole Gospel."). The Archbishop called the rosary a prayer of the heart. "The rosary is the prayer of the saints, part of the secret of their sanctity...we need the rosary."

Kelly writes that the rosary is,"...a powerful prayer, it settles our hearts and minds, creating a peace that is rare and beautiful. It just works."

Mary—Mother of Christ, Mother of the Church.
