

Feed the Needy Ministry Update

As we approach the holidays, our ministry needs the assistance of our parishioners in several areas. This will ensure that the homeless and needy persons experience a joyous Christmas Season.







Rapid Response Network

Members of the St. James Social Justice Ministry (SJM) periodically contact our representatives and/or the federal government to comment on pending legislation or administrative actions that may impact segments of our society, especially those on the margins.

In one recent example members signed onto a letter from the US Conference of Catholic Bishops to the Administration, urging it to restore the Refugee Resettlement program. Issues that might be addressed include human trafficking, homelessness, immigration, environmental justice, and others.

In an effort to increase our voice, the SJM is initiating the Rapid Response Network. If the SJM becomes aware of an urgent or timely social issue, Network members will be notified by email and asked to sign a petition or send a draft letter (via host website). Participation in any notification is totally voluntary and private, and email addresses will not be used for any other purpose.

Gospel Meditation

Where would you go if the world was ending?

What would you do? The last decade has seen a rise in doomsday prepping, the marketing of survival techniques, and a sea of products designed for you to weather the apocalypse.

"The days will come when there will not be left a stone upon another that will not be thrown down," Jesus warns in today's Gospel.

On the one hand, he is referring to the literal downfall of the city of Jerusalem. Indeed, many of his prophecies here have come true over the last few millennium. Nations have indeed "rise[n] against nation[s]," kingdoms against kingdoms. Surf any world news website today alone, and you will see stories of "powerful earthquakes, famines, and plagues." Jesus' advice to his disciples, however, isn't to build a bunker. It's to persevere in faith ... which won't be easy.

"They will seize and persecute you ... you will be handed over ... you will be hated because of my name."

This warning, too, has come to pass in the Church throughout history in state-sponsored persecutions and martyrdoms. Jesus is the Messiah, but his first coming was not a coming of earthly victory. Any disciple of his can expect a challenge. The coming of Christ didn't disrupt our free will. Evil still exists and sometimes even appears to triumph. This does not mean God has abandoned His people!

Jesus reminds the disciples — and us — of his constant presence.

"I myself shall give you a wisdom in speaking."

In other Gospel passages, Jesus promises and sends the Holy Spirit upon his followers. The presence of God is real in our lives, no matter what trials come our way.

It's tempting to be distracted or dismayed by natural destruction and moral evil in the world. But the Church has weathered greater storms. The sacredness of the human person endures.

We can have hope!

Q: In writing about the saints, author Matthew Kelly asks a thought-provoking question:

"How would your life be different if you treated every person in your life as if he or she were Jesus?

A: In a discussion of how the world would be different if we treated each other this way, Kelly outlines the events and challenges in the lives of the saints such as St. Mother Teresa and St. Therese of Lisieux. Here we find two exemplary lives of crowning faith, service, grace, and abiding love. Their simple holy acts of love as they actually lived the Gospel are an invitation for us to think and live differently as true believers.

The catechism concurs: "...by uniting us to Christ in active love, ...Grace ensures our merit before God. The Saints have always had a lively awareness that their merits were pure grace."

As for our own efforts toward leading lives of merit, Kelly points out that each moment of our lives is an opportunity to love; a saintly love of God's good news and (gracefully), a love of one another.
