Pastor's Letter

Dear Friends and Families of St. James,

Pentecost

Over the years I've been fascinated by the Holy Spirit and the idea or reality it conveys. I think the fascination is more with the meaning of 'spirit' and how we use it. In Latin the word 'spiritus' means 'breath' and its companion verb 'spirare', to breathe.

From that word comes many other words we use frequently:

Aspire:	to breathe toward something
Conspire:	to breathe together
Expire:	to end breathing
Inspire:	to breathe in a new breath
Perspire:	to breathe through
Respire:	to breathe again and again
Suspire:	to breathe from below
Transpire:	to breathe across

When we use most of these words we rarely think of 'breath'. We have some other thing in mind. Yet, breath is still there at the center of them all.

There is one other word though, when we simply use the word itself, 'spiritus' in Latin, 'spirit' in English. Breath, the very essence of our life. We don't say, 'keep your heart beating'. We say, 'keep breathing'.

What we breathe is important and so we often talk about needing a 'breath of fresh air', but even that falls short. The breath that we truly long for and which changes us completely is the 'breath of God', the 'Spirit of God' the 'Holy Spirit'.

Do we just want the breath of God to blow over us or do we long for the breath of God to be what we breathe, what enters deeply into us and gives life to every cell of who we are?

As we celebrate Pentecost this Sunday we don't just remember flames of fire or a dove coming down upon the Apostles. We celebrate the very Breath of God that entered into them creating a new reality within them that empowered them to understand and live life from God.

This Pentecost, and every time we pray for the Holy Spirit, we open our life that the very breath of God comes upon us and within us to every fiber of our being, in each breath we take.

This Friday, our teens and adults will receive the Sacrament of Confirmation. They will be prayed over by Bishop Trudeau that the Holy Spirit will breathe deeply into them a new life from the breath of God.

May the Holy Spirit always be your breath of life as well. Blessings,

Or you are worried that you won't be welcomed here.



Knowing your gifts

"It will be as when a man who was going on a journey called in his servants and entrusted his possessions to them. To one he gave five talents; to another, two; and to a third, one – to each according to his ability. Then he went away. Immediately, the one who had five talents went and traded with them, and made another five. Likewise the one who received two made another two. But the one who received one went off and dug a hole in the ground and buried his master's money" – Mt. 25:14-18

The quintessential stewardship parable that Jesus told is the parable of the talents. We ca take for granted the reality that we should use that which God has given us to grow it more abundantly to offer it back to God. But I feel for the fearful servant who was too afraid to do much with the one talent he was given. I think he was afraid, not just because he had no real idea how to grow one talent into anything. He was really unaware of what he had been given.

One day I was teaching a class on giftedness and strengths. I said that we know when we are using gifts God gave us because we are happiest at those times. A woman immediately shared with the group she was giving up reading at Mass. I asked why because I thought she was good at it. She said every time she has to read she leaves the house with knots in her stomach. She felt that even though she found a way to compensate, this was not God's gift to her Weeks later she found me at Mass and grabbed my arm, saying, "Today is my first day as an Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion and I left the house happy as can be! Thank you!"

How can you be a good steward when you don't know what God has given you? Many are in that situation. I truly believe that we are created so uniquely that we may have that one talent that no one else had been given. The other servants in the story made more from what they had been given. But the fearful servant may have been given the one talent he could have grown into a fortune.

Take time to reflect

What are 3 characteristics that make me special? What do I do regularly to grow those into real strengths to use for God's glory?

"Myth-Busting" Abduction Statistics

News sources hyper-focus on abductions by strangers, generating fear and anxiety that these abductions happen often and everywhere. According to data from the National Center for Missing & Exploited Children (NCMEC), however, about 100 children per year are abducted by strangers nationwide. It is far, far more likely that a missing child ran away from home or was enticed to leave home by someone he knows or trusts. More than 80% of missing children reported to NCMEC have left home under their own power, even if their decision to leave was coerced. Catholic Q & A J.P. Alegria

Topic: And the Word was God

Scripture tells us that around the year 50 AD, Silas and Timothy came down from Macedonia, where they joined Paul as companions on his missionary travels.

This Apostle, previously, famously and miraculously converted to believer on a dusty Damascus road, had now just left Athens on another road, moving on to Corinth, a Greek city-state located on an isthmus about halfway between Athens and Sparta. The Book of Acts:18 describes the Greek-speaking Apostle Paul,

"...preaching the word, testifying to the Jews that the Messiah was Jesus."

After some difficult days facing some hard-hearted groups in the Jewish community, Paul had a vision. In that vision the Lord said: **"Do not be afraid.** Go on speaking, and do not be silent, for I am with you."

Don't be afraid. Don't be anxious. Fear not.

Sources relate that the Bible contains 365 citations about not allowing fear and anxiety to hinder true faith. Certainly these words of comfort from the pages of scripture speak to each of us with calming and guiding assurance, applicable in so many life moments.

A musical aspect of this theme comes from Jesuit Priest and composer Robert Dufford, drawing inspiration from The Book of Isaiah and The Book of Luke. Our Choir sings this song found in the *Choral Praise* songbook in the section labeled "Trust." The song's title is *Be Not Afraid:*

"You shall cross the barren desert, but you shall not die of thirst.

You shall wander far in safety though you do not know the way.

You shall speak your words in foreign lands and all will understand.

You shall see the face of God and live. Do not be afraid. I go before you always... I am with you through it all..."

These are words of comfort. Words that St. Paul and all of us can hold dear.


"For I am with you."

It leaves us then to replace fear with trust .

Gospel Meditation— Father John Muir

When I was twenty-two years of age in August of 2000, I experienced World Youth Day in Rome.

As for many of my generation, the event was life-changing for me. Surrounded by joyful, hope-filled young people from seemingly every nation and tongue, we were gathered around the Pope, sharing a common Faith and love. The Pope spoke to us of our shared family bond in the Church and invited us to give our lives in service to others. Now twenty-four years later, my life as a priest, like that of so many others from those special days, continues on that same path of love and unity — despite my many weaknesses.

What makes that continuation possible?

This week's feast gives the answer: the Holy Spirit. The gift of God — His very life — the third person of the Trinity, is the Spirit who animates the entire Church and each member of it. He makes us one-in-love in a way that utterly exceeds human capacity. For example, he makes the apostles speak with tongues of fire, and everyone hears them in his own native tongue. The Holy Spirit is the means by which Jesus establishes a new family, one that crosses all possible boundaries of time, space, and culture. The Holy Spirit never tires in enthusing us for mission.

Aren't we longing to experience the Holy Spirit in a fresh way? Today we celebrate this untiring flame, once ignited on earth and burning still.

So, we humbly cry out: Come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful, and enkindle in us the fire of your love!
