Sons of Mary Mother of Mercy, SMMM, is my male Religious Congregation founded in 1970. Our founder was the first bishop of the Catholic Diocese of Umuahia in the Southeastern part of Nigeria.

Our Charism is - bearing witness to the Mercy of God, following the footsteps of Christ the Savior and Mary our mother of Mercy. This Mercy is expressed in compassion, forgiveness, and kindness.

Our Religious Order is a Missionary Congregation of priests and brothers and the first indigenous Religious Congregation



for men founded in West Africa by an African, for the worldwide mission. The purpose of its foundation is to work for the glory of God, in honor of the Blessed Virgin Mary and for the salvation of souls. Thus, our members make our lives signs of God's love for a sinful world.

As our apostolates, priest members of our Congregation



work and teach in schools as Principals, teachers, university professors, ministry in parishes, and Chaplains in hospitals and

prisons. Our members, who are religious brothers, produce sacred vestments, teach in schools, work as catechists in parishes and care for the sick and needy.

We provide priestly ministries in Nigeria, Cameroun, Ghana, Canada, United States of America, Italy, Germany, Luxemburg, Switzerland, Austria, Belgium, United Kingdom and Ireland. About 29 of our members are working in different dioceses in the United States.

About Our Projects:

1. The completion of classroom buildings for education of the poor in rural communities where our brothers are working.

One of the major problems we encounter in our places of apostolate in Nigeria and other African countries is lack formal education for the poorest



of the poor. Our congregation builds schools and offers



scholarships to the indigent population. We appeal for your help in this regard. Currently we are building some classroom blocks which are at different stages of

construction. We need your support to help us offer sound Catholic education to this less privileged population.



2. Training of our seminarians to continue our missionary work around the world.

In the words of Our Lord Jesus Christ in Mathew 9:37-38, "The harvest is indeed plentiful, but the laborers are few, so pray for the Lord of the harvest to send laborers into his vineyard." We have many vocations in Nigeria, but due to insufficient resources caused by the poor economic situation of Nigeria, we do not have enough

financial capacity to provide for them, which is why we only admit very few among those who aspire for



discernment of their vocation to the catholic priesthood.

Currently, we have over 70 major seminarians in their different stages of discernment to priesthood. I believe that you are always ready and willing to bear true

witness to the compassionate heart of Christ Jesus, by going to mission through giving. As Catholics, united by our faith in God and by our membership of the body of Christ, we call on you, to align with us in raising laborers to work in the vineyard of the Lord.



I know you have responded to this type of call countless number of times in the past, and you have never stopped demonstrating your generosity. Once again, we solicit your financial help, so that we can fully actualize these projects.



Catholic Q & A

J.P. Alegria

Topic: Sacred Mysteries

With its Liturgy of the Eucharist, Liturgy of the Word, Psalms and Penitential Rites, the enduring Catholic Mass is dynamic, inspirational, and spiritually enriching.

The celebrated "sacred mysteries" offer many lessons of grace.

The Celebrant, (or the newer term more in use, Presider,) as the ordained minister, takes the lead in offering the Mass by presenting the good news with an often beautifully enlightening homily.

Taking the lead on the Tenth Sunday of Ordinary Time was Bishop Trudeau. The Bishop, (in formal terms he would be addressed as "Your Excellency" or "Your Grace",) spoke in gracefully appealing tones about human nature and the teachings of Christianity.

The Bishop described Adam and Eve in the reading from Genesis as less than virtuous in their words of sinful rationalization and in their deeds after the fall.

Amid this liturgical theme of highs and lows in human nature, this was also a week when the Church marked the Memorial of St. Barnabas, who is celebrated as an Apostle with selfless, charitable virtue at the time of the early Church in Antioch.

Q: How did His Excellency recognize some exemplars of human virtue among those here at St. James?

A: Deacon Bob and Patti Miller were honored for their years of dedicated, inspirational service. Also representative of the higher virtues, St. James eighth graders and their parents were commended for their dedication to academic, societal, and spiritual growth.

Pope Francis calls the Mass

"a beautiful, transformative encounter with Jesus." In describing the liturgy the Holy Father uses terms such as beauty, truth, and unity.

That Mass presided over by our learned Bishop manifested those very virtues of beauty, truth, and unity:

The beauty of God's inviolable word and equally inviolable merciful love to the fallen in a garden and sinners everywhere.

The truth of the Eucharistic Celebration whereby God is with us.

The unity of a congregation that sees the face of Jesus reflected in the Diaconate Community, as well as among students, parents, and educators, was evident as they went forth into the world singing a song of discipleship based on Matthew Chapter 5: "Go Make A Difference."

Now that was a spiritually enriching Mass.

Gospel Meditation— Father John Muir

Right now, you and I are only worried about one of only two things:

wind or water.

Bear with me. This week we hear the account of the terrified disciples waking Jesus in a sea-storm. He chastises them for their lack of faith, and then,

"rebuking the wind, he said to the sea, 'Quiet, be still!"

He rebukes the wind and stills the water.

In the Bible wind and water represent the two most fundamental poles of our experience of creation.

Wind means heaven, spirit, that which gives identity, unity, order, light.

Water stands for earth, variation, potential, that which can be drawn into identity, darkness, chaos.

Too much "wind" is when things get way too rigid, abstract and ideological — when we face oppressive leaders and tyrants, when we get addicted to our own way of doing things, when our attention is too narrowly focused on one thing.

Too much "water" is excessive novelty, passivity, indifference, and chaos — when our attention is too broadly diffused on many things, when things seem to be crumbling without direction into the dark abyss.

We know both terrifying experiences all too well.

The point of the miracle is that God in Christ is the One who brings final cosmic harmony between these two vital but threatening forces.

He ultimately does so from the wood of the cross, when he breathes forth the wind of his spirit and pours forth the water from his side to establish a new creation, filled with harmonious peace.

When the wind and water are out of control, trust him.


