I have always tried, with the help of the Pastoral Council and Finance Council, to do the best for the parish for the present needs and for the future vitality of this community. I know that during the years some have been hurt by something I may have said, done or not done, but to the best of my ability I have not intentionally tried to offend anyone, and if I have offended you, I am sorry and ask your forgiveness.

Retirement for priests is not retirement from ministry, just retirement from administration. I expect to be actively serving the community at St. Bernard in Bellflower.

Thank you so much. You remain always in my heart and in my prayers and may God continue to bless us all.

Catholic Q & A

Topic: Servants of God

A parishioner closed his Bible and pondered the serious challenges and the often woeful travails of the souls who populate the pages of scripture across the ages. Feeling slightly desolate and vaguely anguished about the vicissitudes of life, he went to Mass.

Q: What did the Mass have to say to the faithful that day?

A: Monsignor Mike, in his final 10 AM Mass as Pastor of St. James Church, began by acknowledging aspects of human brokenness and the weakness present within each of us. Our Pastor offered, as he has countless times, positive spiritual direction. Ours is a faith, he reminded, that can look to the compassionate mercy of God.

The power of God's grace was evident in that day's Gospel from Mark. The winds of uncertainty that buffeted the boat and frightened the disciples on that long ago fateful day on the Sea of Galilee were becalmed by the reassuring spirit of a loving God. Fear not...

In the First Reading the Lord addressed Job out of the storm with a sense of calm. As we move amid the various storms along our own journey of faith we must remember, as Monsignor reminded the congregation, the words of Psalm 46:

"Be still, and know that I am God."

And, in retirement or not, with fullness of heart, in concert with the will of a merciful God, all of us continue to echo the majestic refrain of that familiar and beloved song of Ministry and Mission:

"Here I Am, Lord...I have heard you calling..."

And we sing yet again, with the comfort of His assurances:

"Be not afraid. I go before you always, Come follow me, and I will give you rest."

Gospel Meditation— Father John Muir

Sin isn't given its due these days.

Downplaying sin is dangerous. But there is also another spiritual misstep in which we make way too big a deal out of sin. It happens, for example, when we persistently wonder if our confessed sins are "really" forgiven, or suspiciously ponder what God "really" thinks about us, behind His merciful face. Or when someone returns to Church, and we question whether his or her conversion was genuine. Or when we commit some sin and put on a sad face for days, thinking, "Maybe my sins are too great for God to deal with." God save us from that attitude!

Well, he does just that, this week, in the raising of Jairus' daughter. The dead twelve-year-old's house is filled with a spirit of excessive moaning and groaning, tumultuous weeping and wailing. They even laugh at Jesus in a mocking tone. It's shocking how *easy* it is for him to raise the dead child. It is equivalent to gently waking a kid from a light nap. And then he sends her off to get some lunch. No big whoop. The overactive drama is actually part of the problem, and removing it is a key part of the miracle.

Friends, sin can and does kill, but Jesus is *always* ready and able to raise us back to life, often without much hullabaloo. His ease of forgiving should never be a pretext for presumption, minimizing sin, or taking lightly the cost he pays for our sins on the cross. But for God's sake, we often need Jesus to put out the weepers and wailers. He's the Lord. And remember, the girl is not dead, she's just sleeping.


