# Pastor's Letter

#### Dear friends,

It is estimated that close to 30 million people, many of them Christians, were subjected to a depraved mockery of the Last Supper during the opening ceremonies at the Paris Olympics. It is obvious that this assault on one of the most central images of Christian life was very intentional. In his response to the offense, Bishop Robert Barron claimed "this deeply secularist, post-modern society knows who its enemy is, they're naming it, and we should believe them. They are telling us who they are and we should believe them." Satan always profanes that which is sacred.

#### How do we respond?

Some would call for a boycott of the games and their sponsors. Others would promote a writing campaign to the International Olympic Committee or elected officials of France. Those are both well and good, but the best response we can give is a bold witness to the life of faith which is under attack.

I believe that this is our call for a deeper commitment to prayer, worship, and witness. If our opposition believes that Christianity poses the greatest threat to their worldview, it is even more important to give bold witness to our Catholic faith by praying for the conversion of those who persecute us (Matt 5:44-45).

It is critically important to live out a sacramental life by centering our hearts on the Eucharist, the Source and Summit of the Catholic faith, which Jesus instituted at the Last Supper (Matt 26:26-30).

Finally, it is more important than ever to pray for the sanctity of life while we work to strengthen our families against the attacks of the enemy.

Sacred Heart of Jesus, have mercy on us!

# Catholic Q & A

# **Topic: A Call to Faith**

Scripture this week gives us the Book of Jeremiah, who lived in the 600's B.C. a time of violence and extreme political and social upheaval; challenging days in the kingdom of Judah when the Assyrians were in retreat before the ascending Babylonians.

Amid the chaos of those times, the Lord called on Jeremiah to prophesy the Word. The Catholic Bishops tell us that it was mainly after Jeremiah's death that the exiled community finally,

"read and meditated on the lessons of the prophet; his influence evident in Ezekiel. the psalms, and Daniel."

Here at Mass we meditated on the prophet's message about the merits of a worthy shepherd's guiding call. Father Thaddeus spoke about the selflessness and the divinely charitable nature of Jesus, the Good Shepherd.

**Q**: What does the Church say today about "modern prophets" ?

A: Recently, before an Angelus prayer Pope Francis said:

"A prophet is not limited to those we read about in the Bible. Every Catholic, by virtue of baptism, can help others read the present under the action of the Holy Spirit which helps people understand God's plans and align yourselves with them.

The CCC in #166: " Faith...is not an isolated act...the believer should hand it on to others...a link in the great chain of believers... by my faith I help support others in the faith."

So here we are, part of a momentous chain of faith as described in the Catechism. It's a chain linked to the Good Shepherd, to the lessons of prophecy, and to one another. A chain forged by the power and will of the author of life, marked by the grace of selflessness and divine charity; a chain, as the Holy Father said in alignment with God's plans for believers.

# Gospel Meditation— Father John Muir

Since my college days I've loved a song called "Dance with You" by the rock band Live.

It touches on the deep mystical hunger of our heart:

"I've tasted all the wines/ a half a billion times/ came sickened to your shore/ you showed me what this life is for."

These lines resonate with anyone who has feasted on the good things of this world only to be left spiritually hungover and unsatisfied.

We see a similar dynamic evoked by Jesus' words after he feeds the crowd with bread and fish. To teach them to hunger for God, he recalls God's gift of manna-bread for the hungry ancient Israelites. Those folks had grown spiritually sick from the idolatrous food of Egypt yet still longed for more worthless pagan food. So, God sent heavenly bread to nourish their bodies, but also to heal their distrustful hearts. His people — like us — must learn to hunger and thirst for God alone. Before we can receive that which will not disappoint, we first must cease expecting that earthly goods will satisfy us.

We will get to the Lord's teaching on the Eucharist in the next two weeks. But first, he asks us:

Do you trust me to take care of you? Do you trust me to give you what you need for each day, and to not worry about the next day? Do you see that when you hungrily stuff yourself with the things of this world you become sick and lose your taste for the bread of life?

So, our hungry hearts cry out: Lord, help us to trust that you'll provide for our every need. Help us to use only what we truly need. Help us hunger for the goodness of your Son, who is the true bread from heaven.

That is what this life is for.
