# What is Eucharistic Adoration?



Here I am to worship, Here I am to bow down, Here I am to say that you are God.

Benediction and Adoration after the 8am Mass until 12 noon Friday, August 16<sup>th</sup>

#### Holy Hour Adoration <sup>•</sup>Friday, August 23<sup>rd</sup> at 7pm

Eucharistic adoration is simply worshiping the real presence of Jesus in the form of consecrated bread and wine—fully the body, blood, soul and divinity of our Savior in the Eucharist. It is an extension of the Mass.

The Catholic Church teaches us adoration of the Eucharist extends our union with Christ after we receive Him during Mass. This worship of Jesus outside of Mass helps us maintain what we received during Communion. When we put Mass and adoration together, we first consume our Lord so He becomes part of us, and then we gaze on Him in adoration while He gazes on us in total love.

Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI explained it beautifully while still Cardinal Ratzinger in *God is Near Us: The Eucharist, Heart of Life*:

#### Saints: See Holiness

The Church, amid its week 21 of Ordinary Time, marks Wednesday, August 28<sup>th</sup> as the Feast Day of St. Augustine of Hippo.

**Q:** What does Pope Francis say about Augustine: Bishop of Hippo; foremost theologian; author of a landmark of world literature titled *Confessions;* and an esteemed Doctor of the Church?

*A:* Pope Francis considers the life and legacy of this fourth-century bishop, marking the spiritual conversion which took Augustine from what the Catholic News Agency describes as *"restless youth to finding peace in Christ."* 

The Holy Father said, "Be like St. Augustine and examine the story of your life." Place Christ at the center of your life" The Pope recommended studying the lives of the saints to help recognize how God acts in a person's life.

Father Matt has spoken about the negativity and fruitlessness of undesirable, base emotions and the meanest of human appetites. Augustine, of the ancient North African town of Hippo was living in such a morass; a dissipated life. In Butler's *Lives of the Saints* we find Augustine's saintly mother, Monica, who was raised in a Christian family, unceasingly praying for the conversion of her eldest son. Augustine heard the word and finally saw the light.

The Lives of the Saints. Amazing lessons of humanity, conversion, faith and discernment of self.

Our choir echoes the Holy Father's admonitions in a hymn based on Psalm 16:

"O Lord, you are the center of my life: I will always praise you, I will always serve you. I will always keep you in my sight... You will show me the path of life..." Be like St. Augustine.

#### Gospel Meditation — Father John Muir

A priest I know was asked by a door-to-door evangelist, **"Do you believe in Jesus?"** He answered, "Yes, I do. But if I may ask you," he continued, "Where do you experience Jesus' body and blood?" His interlocutor responded somewhat confusedly, "I don't. I just believe in him. That's all that is needed." Later my priest friend would relate to me, "The more I thought about it, that response struck me as totally inadequate. As human beings, we need to encounter Jesus' body and blood, not just hear about him and mentally believe. Otherwise, Jesus is just a ghost."

This week we see this central point as we arrive at the climactic moment of Jesus' teaching on the Eucharist. Jesus has established the importance of believing in him as the "**bread of life come down from heaven**." Belief deeply matters because it leads to a real, bodily encounter with Jesus through eating and drinking. That's why Jesus emphasizes to an almost outrageous degree the non-metaphorical necessity to "**eat my flesh and drink my blood**" (John 6:54). The real presence of Jesus' body and blood — he himself, truly, really, substantially — has been the Church's treasure since Holy Thursday. Internal belief in the heart *and* the ritual act of eating and drinking the Eucharist, the Church has stubbornly insisted on *both*, not just one or the other.

This is not meant to criticize non-Catholic Christians who deeply trust and love Jesus, nor is it a triumphal elitist claim about the Catholic Mass. Rather it is a humble, trusting acknowledgement that God in Jesus comes to us in a way most proper to human beings: in our hearts *and* our bodies, faith *and* the Eucharist.
