## **Pastor's Letter**

Dear Friends,

My mother always had a special fondness for the bells during Mass.

She would tell her four boys that a miracle was taking place on the altar each time we heard the bells. A miracle was indeed taking place, but her liturgical lessons were lost on four boys who were constantly distracted at Mass. We were completely lost on the concept that the ordinary bread and wine brought forward at Offertory would become the Body and Blood of Jesus, a supernatural, superabundant gift of grace from Creator to creature.

The bells are used to call the faithful's attention to three key moments in the Liturgy to focus our attention on the sacrifice taking place on the altar. The first ring takes place at the "Epiclesis ("invocation upon"), which is the intercession in which the priest begs the Father to send the Holy Spirit, the Sanctifier, so that the offerings may become the body and blood of Christ and that the faithful by receiving them, may themselves become a living offering to God." (Catechism 1105) The elevation of the host and chalice take place during the anamnesis where "the Holy Spirit "recalls" to the assembly all that Christ has done for us." (Catechism 1103)

Why do I bring the story/use of bells to mind?

In our Gospel this week, Jesus quotes a passage from Isaiah's prophecy,

"This people honors me with their lips, but their hearts are far from me."

Like the Murphy boys, we encounter distractions during Mass and prayer, that while we participate in the call and response during Mass, our hearts are far from Jesus through distractions.

Allow the bells to call your attention back to the most important moment of your day where the Body and Blood of Jesus are being prepared as super substantial bread for our spiritual journey, the Bread which came down from heaven, Jesus himself.



## The Cry of the Poor

As part of their regular morning commute, java aficionados filed in and out of the busy coffee store, mostly oblivious of the lone figure walking aimlessly just outside their sphere of concern. The man began to walk quickly, as though he too had somewhere to go. He slowed and looked around in bewilderment, shuffling off in another direction. This was a lost soul with neither home nor prospects. He had no commute. He had nowhere to go.

That morning a St. James parishioner happened to witness that bit of drama, a scenario of aching, poignant sadness. A word crossed his mind: angst. The dictionary describes the word angst as "a feeling of deep anxiety or dread, typically an unfocused one about the human condition or the state of the world in general."

Q: What words does the Church have that help to bring the state of the world into better focus?

A: Among the scripture readings this week we are in the Book of Job, described as "The dramatic treatment of the problem of the suffering of the innocent. The Book of Job does not definitively answer the problem of the suffering of the innocent, but challenges readers, (and observers of daily life), to come to their own understanding." Job 12 says: "For the soul of every living thing is in the hand of God..."

Pope Francis, addressing the Lazarus Association, whom he described as the eyes and ears and the smile of God to those unfortunate whom they serve, gave the group a message of encouragement, applicable to each of us: "Do not be afraid to pass the torch of hope and love. Be witness to the tenderness of God in the midst of the culture of selfishness, individualism, indifference, waste, contempt for the poor and the weak." Catechism 1397 teaches: "We must recognize Christ in the poorest, his brethren."

Later that day our parishioner bought a sandwich and a bottle of water for a man in need who was sitting outside the market. It wasn't a huge torch of hope, but it was given with a smile.

# Purity isn't popular at the moment.

Or is it?

Look at a rack of health magazines or at popular podcasts. You'll see an infinite ocean of regulations and rituals of diets, intermittent fasting, morning sun rituals, intense juice detox practices, lists of dangerous foods, mental practices, as well as long lists of dos and don'ts for the proper cleaning of clothes, dishes, cars, houses, pets, and children. Like it or not, we long to be pure, clean, and without blemish.

Gospel Meditation — Father John Muir

This question of purity haunted people in Jesus' day, too. The Pharisees and scribes (the leading purity authorities of the day) criticize Jesus, asking, "Why do your disciples not live according to the tradition of the elders, but eat with defiled hands?" (Mark 7:5). Jesus responds by saving,

"There is nothing outside the person that can defile him if it goes into him; but the things that come out of the person are what defile the person" (Mark 7:15).

What does he mean, and how can it help us be pure?

We've probably all heard the somewhat shopworn interpretation that Jesus replaces the ritual, exterior notion of purity with a moral, interior one. Christianity is thus seen as a kind of moral re-tooling, as if religion doesn't make us pure. Good moral intentions do. But this doesn't take the rest of Jesus' ministry seriously enough, nor our obsession with purity. The better reading is that Jesus audaciously offers himself as the ultimate source of human purity — from within each human heart. Both our religious ritual practices and our moral actions are meant to flow from this encounter with Jesus the Lord. When we are in friendship with him, everything becomes pure for us.
