Pastor's Letter

Dear Friends.

This week, I would like to provide the transcript from a reflection given by Dr. Sean Dalton on FORMED.org (Augustine Institute) because I think it has incredible importance in guiding our modern culture:

Today we will reflect on the Gospel reading from Mark, where Jesus heals a deaf man with a speech impediment. It is yet another occasion where Jesus demonstrates that he is the Divine Physician.

According to a poll by the Princeton Religious Research Center, the number of Americans who adhere to New Age practices is alarmingly high, even among professing Christians. Why is this alarming? The New Age movement rejects a personal God, therefore rejecting Christianity, and believes that all of reality is identical with divinity. In other words, God is everything. There is no distinction between Creator and creation.

So how is this errant way impacting the Church?

Nearly half of Catholics say they believe in psychic healing. And one in four Catholics believe the movement of the stars, Astrology, can help govern their affairs.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches

"consulting horoscopes, astrology, palm-reading, interpretation of omens and lots, the phenomena of clairvoyance, and recourse to mediums all conceal a desire for power over time, history, and, in the last analysis, other human beings. As well as a wish to conciliate hidden powers. They contradict the honor, respect, and loving fear that we owe to God alone."

Brothers and sisters, why would we look to anyone or anything other than Jesus and His Church?

Do we not believe He is who He says He is, God in the flesh?

As our Gospel reading today say,

"they were exceedingly astonished and they said he has done all things well. He makes the deaf hear and the muter speak."

I am confident of this, we can recapture our astonishment in Him who does all things well by availing ourselves more and more to His healing touch. We have two sacraments of healing in the Church: **Penance and Anointing of the Sick.** While Jesus can bring about a physical healing through these sacraments, it is the spiritual healing that is most important.

One of the most powerful prayers in the universe is this – God, please bring some good out of this bad situation. God will answer that prayer because that is what God does, brings good out of the bad. God is concerned with our ultimate good – eternal salvation.

So, if being physically healed will most assist our ultimate good, God will heal. However, if not being physically healed will most assist our ultimate good, then God will not heal.

Spiritual healing, however, is another matter.

Every time we receive grace and are forgiven of our sins, we are spiritually healed. Sin wounds and grace heals because grace is God's own life living within us. And no one or thing can give us grace; not the stars, not some energy, not a psychic - but Jesus Christ, in and through His one, holy, catholic, and apostolic church.

So the question is, do you look to Jesus, and to Him alone, for the truth by which to live your life?

And do you look to Jesus, and to Him alone, for the grace, the strength to be able to life that truth?

chips granola bars


lunch meat & cheese 8 oz. water and juices

Songs of Lamentation, Joy, Worship, and Praise

Liturgy and pastoral care have recently guided us through the Bread of Life Discourse. We heard the sadly familiar words in John 6, "many of his disciples returned to their former way." These are words, scholars say, which were recorded in the 90's of the first century.

The Church describes the Gospel of John as starting out with a magnificent prologue of themes and motifs, "not unlike an overture does for a musical work." Jesus says in this discourse:

"The words I have spoken to you are spirit and life."

Simon Peter offers a first century statement of faith, "Master...you have the words of eternal life..."

Q: What other set of familiar liturgical discourses ring out as the divine music of the scriptures?

A: The Book Of Psalms.

In the *Choral Praise* songbook there is a selection in the Psalms and Canticles section called "Your Words are Spirit and Life" which evokes the perfect laws and decrees of the Lord. These are lyrical words of a solidly foundational faith, in harmony with Simon Peter and the Apostles who remained true in faith.

In a General Audience, Pope Francis encouraged today's faithful to

"...engage in a symphony of prayer by praying the Psalms, as Jesus did. The Psalms are prayers for all seasons...the best words to be transformed into prayer. The Psalms help us open ourselves to a prayer that is less focused on ourselves: a prayer of praise, of blessing, of thanksgiving... a voice to all creation."

The Catechism of the Catholic Church, 2589, quotes St. Ambrose on the Psalms:

"A psalm is ...praise of God, the assembly's homage...the voice of the Church... a confession of faith in song."

John's lyrical description of faith continues to resonate across the ages and sacred pages:

Master, you have the words of eternal life... to whom shall we go?

Gospel Meditation — Father John Muir

One of the most touching YouTube videos I've ever seen is one in which a deaf woman receives new technology to heal her hearing. She hears her husband's voice for the first time — and her own, too — and bursts into tears of overwhelming joy. It must have been like an immovable wall between her and her loved ones came tumbling down.

We are all like this woman, to some degree. We believe in the presence of God's love, but we can't hear Him. We can't speak well about Him. The deaf man who can't speak properly in the Gospel today is an image of what God wants us to experience again and again. Jesus takes the man aside to a private place away from the crowd, touches his ears and tongue, and says, "Ephphata!" The man's ears are opened, and he speaks clearly. Contact with Christ has this effect on us.

This experience happens to us in our baptism, almost exactly. It happens to us in the liturgy. It happens in our private prayer. It happens when we hear the voice of God in our conscience. The more we engage these privileged channels of Jesus' healing, the more we are empowered to hear and speak of the presence of God's


