Legion of Mary is Coming to St. James

My Dearest Friends in Christ,

Fr. Matt encourages St. James parishioners to embrace and actively participate in Marian devotions. In addition to Medjugorje Rosary prayer group, he has approved the formation of **The Legion of Mary Association** here to help deepen our devotion to our Blessed Mother Mary.

Drawing his inspiration from the words of our lord Jesus Christ in John 19:26-27 – *"Woman behold your son"* and turning to his beloved disciple he says *"Behold your mother",* St. Pope John Paul II in his General audience of Wednesday, May 7, 1997 states that

"The Church's devotion to the Virgin Mary is not only the fruit of a spontaneous response to the exceptional value of her person and the importance of her role in the work of salvation, but is based on Christ will".

In other words, we honor our blessed mother as the **mother of Christ** our savior, we honor her as **our mother**, and we equally honor her because Christ has mandated us to so by handing her over to us through John.

Therefore, the Legion of Mary association stands as one of the channels of spreading Christ's will to honor His mother and our Mother also.

The Legion of Mary association is an International Catholic Organization of practicing Catholic men and women of all ages founded in 1921 in Dublin, Ireland by Frank Duff. Like a mustard seed, this Marian association has grown and expanded to different parts of the World. It operates in over 170 countries.

The growth and expansion of the association began after Pope Pius XI recognized it in 1931. Presently, the Legion of Mary has over **three million active members and over ten million auxiliary members worldwide**.

Moreover, the spirituality of the Legionaries is centered on "prayer and actions performed for Jesus through Mary in accordance with the will of God the Father" (John Paul II Overview of Legion Spirituality: Address to Italian legionaries, October 30, 1982).

All the deeds of the Legionaries aim at leading people to God and heaven. The basic aim is the sanctification of its members and of the whole world through prayer, sacraments and devotion to Mary and the Trinity.

They imitate the virtues of our blessed Mother Mary which includes **humility**, **obedience**, **patience**, **purity prayer and love of God**. They communicate the love of Christ to the world.

Members are actively involved in spiritual and corporal works of mercy. The Legion of Mary is in so many parishes in the Archdiocese of Los Angeles. In the South Bay, it is in St. Anthony's, American Martyrs and others.

I encourage you, my dear brothers and sisters in Christ, to deepen your devotion to our blessed Mother Mary as Legionaries.

Movie Night





This second evening will dive into how to use the Bible for prayer, both for yourself and with children, as well as providing


tips for reading and praying with the Bible.

Loving and Serving

Outside the Church not long after the final blessing to end a Sunday Mass, with Deacon Bob's admonition to love the Lord by loving and serving one another still fresh in the mind, a car drove by with personalized plates reading: 1COR13.

Q: What serendipitous thread runs through Deacon Bob's charitable words and the text of First Corinthians Chapter 13?

A: St. Paul's first letter written from Ephesus in Asia Minor to the Christian community in Corinth in south central Greece has been described as St. Paul's classical description of charity and love in the New Testament.

Meanwhile, the Catechism has approximately 20 entries listed about love, under the Index Heading: Love (see also Charity.)

It talks about God's commandment about love; love of neighbor and enemies; love as source of human merit; and the various categories and virtues of love. Paragraph 1766 defines love simply as

"to will the good of another."

The aspects of charitable love described in the Catechism are echoed in Paul's letter when he underscores the kind of love which

"bears all things...love never fails."

It is said that "Who does not love does not know God: for God is love." St. Mother Teresa said: "Not all of us can do great things,

but we can do small things with great love."

With so much literature and social/cultural structures and scriptural teachings about the subject of love throughout the ages, perhaps that motorist described above will indeed recall and apply the text of that first letter of Paul, even while behind the wheel .:

"Love is patient, love is kind...it is not quick-tempered, does not brood over injury..."



Maggots, grubs, worms.

When I imagine one or many of these nasty slimy buggers living inside my body — unseen, feeding off my flesh, slowly rotting me out — I feel deeply disgusted.

If I knew I had a worm, I would do anything to remove the alien invader, and fast. But what if I couldn't ever get it out?

This is precisely the image Jesus uses to describe those who cause others to sin and fail to cut out what leads them to sin. He contrasts the kingdom of God with Gehenna. "where the worm does not die." If we can stomach it for a moment, there is much wisdom in this nauseating metaphor.

First, sin is always parasitic.

It feeds on what is good like a worm in a host. It's not symbiotic or additive, as virtue and love always are. Sin invades, devours, and damages the sinner. Second, sin is always social. No matter how hidden, it quietly eats away at others — usually the most poor and vulnerable, the "little ones," as the Lord says. How healthy it is for us to acknowledge this! Our gossiping, greed, over-indulgence, lying, pride, laziness, lust for power and reputation, and so on ... they do not add anything to life. They are worms eating away at others and ourselves.

We cut out these filthy parasites through genuine repentance and bold action.

Imagine the peace and relief that follows the removal of a sickening worm from your body. How much greater is the peace we enjoy when the spiritual worms are gone for good. We'd never wait to act against physical parasites.

Neither should we with the worms of sin.




