# **Pastor's Letter**

Hello Beautiful Children of God!

On the Twenty-Ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time, we read Mark's version of the Sons of Thunder request to sit at Jesus' right and left in his kingdom.

The seats at the right and left of an earthly king serve as the king's advisors, which provides a lofty status for those holding those seats. However, we know that Jesus' kingdom is not of this world, which he revealed to Pilate upon his condemnation.

Jesus is not making his way to Jerusalem to overthrow the Roman powers. He is on his way to Jerusalem to give his life as a ransom for the consequences of our sins. His "hour" comes with an agonizing death on the cross between the thieves at his right and left. His death is the cup from which his disciples will drink.

James was the first Apostle to be martyred (red martyrdom) and his brother John would be spared a brutal death but would endure exile from his homeland for the duration of his life (white martyrdom).

Jesus, the King of kings, came to suffer with those who suffer and called his disciples to that same state in life. James, John, and the rest of the Apostles did drink the cup of death that Jesus drank because he commanded that they follow his example.

In our current culture, there is a tendency toward virtue signaling where individuals take strong positions on causes but do little to act upon their position, or worse, contradict the position through their actions.

If we are to follow Jesus' example, we are called to enter into the suffering of others so that our companionship may ease their suffering.

Our role as disciples is not to provide lip service, but to fully enter into the human experience and to seek justice where injustice is present in our society.

As Christians, we are called to be baptized in the baptism of suffering for the sake of Christ. Discipleship is for the courageous, not the fainthearted or lukewarm.

May we pray for the courage to respond to the needs of our most vulnerable brothers and sisters, regardless of the cost.




# Oct. 20<sup>th</sup> is World Mission Sunday

### My Peace I Give You

One of the dogmatic constitutions issued by the Second Vatican Council which convened in October of 1962 was **Dei Verbum** - the Word of God.

**Q:** What does the Church teach and practice regarding the word of God?

**A**: At Mass we reverence The Liturgy of the Word which includes scripture readings, a homily, and a profession of faith. *The Catechism of the Catholic Church* in Paragraph 132 teaches that "the study of the sacred page should be the very soul of sacred theology."

The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops advises that the Bible should be read daily.

Pope Benedict XVI promulgated that reading the Bible was "essential for Christians to know God."

St. Jerome said, "To read scripture is to converse with God."

In his own Q&A, Pope John Paul II was asked in 1980: Why read the Bible?

He responded that from the word of Jesus we learn the nature of God, we know our eternal destiny, and we learn how we must behave.

Hebrews 4:12 echoes the Holy Father's cogent points about the sacred theological page:

"The word can be living and effective only when we meditate on the message and put it into action in our lives."

So we have the word and we have Saint James 1:22 in the spirit of *Dei Verbum*:

"But be ye doers of the word, and not hearers only..."

# Gospel Meditation — Father John Muir

From a young age, I loved winning at sports.

I confess that winning was a bit of an addiction.

It was probably coming from a deep desire for attention and affirmation from others. Nevertheless, it was a driving motivation for me. Baseball, soccer, track, table tennis, and whatever else I could find was a chance to win

Competition was my obsession.

Another John, and his brother James, demonstrate a kind of wildly competitive obsession when they dare to say to Jesus:

# "Grant us to sit, one at your right hand and one at your left, in your glory"

(Mark 10:37). Their audacity arouses an indigent reaction from the other apostles, who are clearly raw that these two are out to win the highest spots.

How does Jesus respond to us in our desires for greatness?

The same way he does to James and John. He does not criticize them for their desire for glory. But he does highlight their ignorance

#### ("you do not know what you are asking.").

Then he invites them to be champions of true greatness: by drinking not the cup of worldly victory, but his cup of self-giving suffering love, to be the **'slave of all.'** 

The true winners are slaves of love.

This week, dare to tell Jesus what your ambitions truly are. Hear him call you to an even greater victory.


