Pastor's Letter

Hello beautiful children of God!

At one of our recent Neighborhood Gatherings, I received a request to update the community on the future property plans. I am sorry that this hasn't been part of our conversation since I arrived on July 1st. I'm not sure what has been shared with the community, so I will touch briefly on each aspect of the project.

The property at 124 N. PCH is in escrow and the sale is pending upon the approval of a housing project by a local developer. If all goes according to plan, escrow should close in the first quarter of 2025. Please pray that the Redondo Beach Planning Commission grants approval to this project so that we can move forward with our plans.

The parish offices will move from across the street into the first floor of the rectory in January 2025.

In preparation of this change, money from our building fund account will be used to freshen the paint and flooring.

Before I arrived, plans were made to move the preschool to the school property in Torrance, but costs escalated to the point that the build was not financially viable, so I made the decision to close the preschool at the end of this semester (December 2024). Plans for a future preschool will be placed on hold until we address the Community Campus on Broadway.

There are basic sketches for the Community Campus, but plans are still in the very early stages. Please know that discussions on this project will be a community conversation. I spent my internship year under the direction of Fr. Tim Nichols at the time St John Vianney parish was making plans to rebuild their new church.

He made it a point to invite the community into the conversation on the rebuild. We will be following this same model as we journey forward to build our new St. James Parish Center.



All You Holy Men and Women

Q: What does the Church say about All Saints Day

A: It's described as part of a three-day period of remembrance for the dead, which begins with Halloween on October 31st and continues with All Souls Day on November 2nd. Some suggested ways to mark that day include attending Mass, praying to your confirmation saint and reading the Gospel of Matthew.

That particular Gospel includes the Beatitudes that laud some of the characteristics of the saints: sometimes poor in spirit; the meek; those who thirst for righteousness; the merciful; the clean of heart; the peacemakers; the children of God; the salt of the earth.

The Catechism explains that the saints

"constantly care for those whom they have left on earth...the saints share in the living tradition of prayer by the example of their lives..."

Catechism #2683 says,

"Their intercession is their most exalted service to God's plan. We can and should ask them to intercede for us and for the whole world."

Saints were human beings with all the faults, graces, and challenges imaginable (and often), unimaginable. The Roman Catholic Church recognizes more than 10,000 saints. Pope Benedict and Pope Francis include St. Joseph as one of their favorite saints, calling St, Joseph,

"the man who gave God the greatest proof of trust..."

Author Matthew Kelly writes in his book *Rediscover the Saints* that we can follow the examples of the saints in terms of

"exploring our God-given potential and realizing the possibilities enfolding in our being. The saints encourage us, light a fire within us, and captivate us to "collaborate with God."

The Church venerates the Saints with awesome reverence. As children of God we continue to say:

All you holy men and women, pray for us.

Gospel Meditation — Father John Muir

Americans have long been fascinated with public debates.

Farmers stood in muddy fields for hours to hear Lincoln and Douglas dispute each other in the 1860 presidential run-up. The televised debate between Kennedy and Nixon in 1960 fascinated the nation. These days, cable news outlets and social media parse every word spoken by candidates. We still love seeing public, rational disputes in the service of our nation.

In his day, Jesus also captured attention as a public debater. Mark tells us,

"And one of the scribes came up and heard them disputing with one another, and seeing that he answered them well, asked him, 'Which commandment is the first of all?""

Jesus' brief but all-encompassing response is the double command to love God and neighbor. Notice that he includes the importance of loving God with "all your mind."

Loving God is not simply a question of affection, loyalty, good deeds, and religious dedication. It demands honest and intense intellectual engagement — just like an accomplished debater.

How do we do this practically?

One simple way is by embracing ourselves as life-long learners. Setting aside time for reading, book studies, online classes, and, perhaps most difficult, engaging in open, honest, and curious conversation with those who think differently from us. These are all great ways to love God with our minds. Our country and our Church depend greatly on souls who love God in this way with their minds. Let's commit to loving God with all our minds in tireless pursuit of truth.


