### Pastor's Letter

Hello Beautiful Children of God!

Recently, I watched a wonderful movie titled "Radiating Joy: The Michelle Duppong Story." It tells the story of a

young woman who suffered greatly from the effects of cancer, and died on Christmas day in 2015 at the age of 31. Her life was dedicated to serving God as a FOCUS missionary and Director of Adult Faith Formation for the Diocese of Bismarck, ND. However, the story focuses primarily on the manner in which she radiated joy through



intense suffering. Michelle's life left a lasting impact on those she served (and served with) in ministry and those who served her during hospital stays. This effect didn't occur because she possessed superior physical or mental qualities than others, but because she spent her life preparing to encounter the Lord in every moment. Her greatest gift to the world was the gift that was freely given to her, God's grace. Her preparation for service and suffering occurred through a life of prayer, time in front of the tabernacle, and participation in the sacraments. Her witness left no doubt that the grace of God was working miracles in the life of this young lady. Michelle is now recognized as a Servant of God as her bishop has opened the case for her canonization.

Her story speaks to our hearts in this season of Advent, which is the liturgical season set aside to prepare our hearts for Christ's coming. He comes to us in three ways; his birth in Bethlehem, his coming again at the end of time, and his coming into our hearts every day. Like Michelle, we are all called to participate in the life of grace. The wisdom of the Church provides the seasons of Lent and Advent to grow in those practices that will help us encounter our Lord in the extraordinary and ordinary events of life. Advent reminds us that we should enter every day with the intention to know, love, and serve the Lord.

Let's spend this Advent season with the intention to encounter the Lord in a new way. Maybe we need to make a concerted effort to attend Mass every week. Perhaps our prayer life could benefit from making an entry on your calendar as a reminder for daily prayer. It may be that it's time to renew your soul by making a long overdue confession. Whatever prompting the Holy Spirit has placed on your heart in recent days, it is time to answer "yes" during this season of Advent. Now is the time to participate in the life of grace so that our hearts will be prepared for the Lord's coming; past, present, and future.

### A Votre Sante (To Your Health)

Pope John Paul II wrote cogently and inspirationally about Catholics achieving a spiritually holistic state of being:

"Allow the light and the healing presence of Christ to shine brightly through your lives. In that way, all those who come in contact with you will discover the loving kindness of God."

Here at Saint James that loving kindness of God is reflected in our Pastoral Team.

**Q:** What's an example of that healing presence and loving kindness?

A: One illustrative example of that light and healing presence was Father Jim's recent Sunday homily. That homily presented an emotional spectrum, from Psalm 16 with its scriptural assurances about the Lord as our inheritance so that "we shall not be disturbed," to the scary gospel passage in Mark about a darkened sun and moon, with stars falling from the sky. That homily also touched on another aspect of that Sunday's message by way of tracing Father's journey along his difficult road of personal health challenges.

In preparation for the Solemn World Day of the Sick back in 2013 the Vatican wrote about these enduringly relevant themes of health challenges and the saving power of God. Those writings included the Good Samaritan, the Sacraments of healing, Anointing of the Sick, Eucharistic Communion, the Ten Lepers, God's will, and the love of the Church to whom we turn in times of health challenges.

Father Jim endured difficult circumstances, while maintaining a desire to help improve medical treatment for others. He reflects that loving kindness of Christ which Pope John Paul described and upon which we pray for ourselves and loved ones.

As we read in Jeremiah 30 "For I will restore health unto thee, and I will heal thee of thy wounds, saith the Lord." Allow the light to shine.

### Gospel Meditation — Father John Muir

When I was a young priest, about one year after ordination, I was called to the hospital to anoint a dying mother of three young children.

She had a painful, terminal cancer. After celebrating Last Rites with her, I said, "Don't be afraid." She looked me square in the eye from her hospital bed and said, "Oh Father, I am in a lot of pain, but I am not afraid. Something wonderful is about to happen." A few days later she died.

Christians face the ending of our personal various "worlds" in a totally unique way. This first Sunday of Advent, Jesus says that when people see their world falling apart, they find themselves

"fainting with fear and with foreboding of what is coming on the world" (Luke 21:26).

In our fear, our natural response is to check out, to hide our heads in drunkenness, distraction, and false securities. But Jesus commands us to

"look up and raise your heads, because your redemption is drawing near."

He then compares what's coming to a lovely summer in full bloom. That's what the cross and resurrection empower us to do, as strange as it may seem.

Advent challenge: What world in your life is collapsing? A relationship, a dream, a work opportunity? Maybe you're troubled by a crumbling world in the political or economic sphere.

Or maybe someone you love is seriously ill or dying. Name that world or worlds.

Then pray: 'Lord, help me to not faint with fear.

Help me to raise my head and
see your redemption coming."


