#### Pastor's Letter

Hello Beautiful Children of God!

The lyrics of "O Come, O Come Emmanuel" echo throughout our Advent journey.

The song retells the story of the Israelite community who "mourns in lonely exile" in Babylon, and longs to be free to return to their homeland in Jerusalem. Our Gospel for this Second Sunday in Advent (Lk 3:1-6) quotes from the Prophet Isaiah that Israel will indeed be free if only they repent and "make straight the way of the Lord." History tells us that the Israelites did return to Jerusalem, but their hearts still wavered.

In that same Gospel, we are introduced to the figure of John the Baptist, who is the "voice crying out in the desert" to prepare the way of the Lord. John preached from the desert banks of the Jordan River, which means that Israel was home physically, but not spiritually.

Therefore, John proclaims a baptism of repentance to help them complete their spiritual journey home to the Lord.

After sharing my vocation story with many people and recounting the twenty years I spent away from Christ and His Church, a great number of people share that they have been away for a considerable amount of time and have no idea how to return.

Well, my dear friends, the answer is simple...repent.

One need only to cross the threshold of the church and go directly to the confessional to return home. It is in the mercy seat of the confessional that we encounter God's forgiveness and love.

Every Advent season reminds us to seize this opportunity to be freed from our sins through the sacrament of Reconciliation.

We will host a **Community Penance Service** at St James on Tuesday, December 17<sup>th</sup> at 7pm where 10-12 priests

from the local area will hear individual confessions.

Also, our parish offers the sacrament of reconciliation every Saturday night from 4-5pm or by appointment.

I encourage our entire community to avail yourselves to this precious gift of God's grace.







#### A Call to Hope

Q: What is Advent?

A: The Catechism describes the liturgy of Advent as the time when the Church makes present "the ancient expectancy of the Messiah." The Bishops remind us that it's a time of preparation, "directing our hearts and minds to Christ's second coming." This year Advent is from Sunday December 1 to Tuesday the 24th. The word Advent is from the Latin, "ad-venire" or, "to come to."

The USCCB also teaches about Advent songs of theology that are sung with the repeated use of the imperative "Come!" an embodiment of the longing of all for the Divine Messiah. The songs are known as O Antiphons. Some of the titles of these songs are: O King Of All Nations; O Emmanuel Our King. O Key of David. Pope Benedict XVI wrote: "Advent is a time to understand God's presence, a time to learn from Mary, the Woman of Advent; a time to live out our faith." Pope Francis: "On the first Sunday of Advent we should awaken from our slumber and to always be aware of the presence of God and to welcome Him in our daily lives. Invite God to draw close during the new liturgical year. Advent is an incessant call to hope."

As in Lenten days we see the clergy at Advent in vestments of purple,(except the Third Sunday when Rose is the color); purple being the color of penance and preparation.

St. Augustine, quoted in Latin: "Timeo lesum transeuntem" "*I fear that Jesus will pass by me unnoticed.*" The Catholic News Agency says that when we are distracted by many vain things we may indeed lose sight of what is essential.

Advent, then finds us amid the stillness, listening for the word of God that directs our hearts and minds to respond to that ancient, incessant call of hope. His word at Advent:

"To all, I say, be watchful."



#### Gospel Meditation — Father John Muir

In the year 1995, in the seventeenth year of my life, when Fife Symington was governor of Arizona, Bill Clinton was president of the United States, Chuck Keiffer was pastor of St. Theresa parish in Phoenix, Arizona, and Ron and Mary were my parents, the word of God came to my youth minister Eric and through him I started to see the salvation of God. Soon, Christ came into my life never to leave. I'm thankful beyond words.

Why am I being so specific, you ask?

Because in the Gospel this week we hear the specific names of people holding civic and religious authority in first century Palestine when "the word of God came to John the Baptist:" Tiberius Caesar, Pontius Pilate, Herod, Philip, Lysanias, Annas, Caiaphas, and Zechariah. All this is meant to help us see that God breaks into our *history*, into real human events. Jesus is no mere myth. He is the Word-which-breaks-in, in concrete moments, you might say. And now we anticipate his coming once again in our specific situations.

#### Advent challenge:

Name as many civic and religious leaders who are in authority currently in your life. Now, name who the potential John the Baptists may be.

A spouse? A friend? A podcaster?

A work colleague who brings God's word to you?

Spend a moment considering that this comprises the concrete, historical setting into which Christ wishes to come. Then, with these specifics in mind, pray:

"Come, Lord Jesus. Come."
