Pastor's Letter

Hello Beautiful Children of God!

On this Third Sunday of Advent, otherwise known as Guadete Sunday, our hearts are filled with joy. Guadete is the Latin word for rejoice, which is the theme of Zephaniah's prophecy in our first reading.

Why does he implore us to rejoice?

REJOICE

According to the prophecy, the "mighty Lord is in our midst" as a savior. The savior has "turned back our

enemies and remove his judgment against us." This is indeed cause for rejoicing!

However, Zephaniah preached to the people of God in 600BC, which meant that the promised savior was still 600 years away. That is why the Israelites hearts are "filled with expectation" at the thought that John the Baptist might be the long-awaited Messiah. John was different. He wore strange clothing, ate a strange diet, and preached a less than soothing message. One would think that few would pay attention to such a figure, but the Gospels tell us that people were coming from all over Judea to listen to him and receive a baptism of repentance.

Why the need for repentance?



Just as John was the forerunner

of Jesus' earthly ministry, repentance prepares us for God's great work of salvation. The fact that so many yearned to hear John's preaching tells us that human heart has a deeper

hunger for God and His truth. In today's Gospel, John encourages us sinners to put their lives in right order by orienting our lives according to God's will.


Are we ready and willing to turn away from sin and turn toward God during our Advent journey?

Let us heed Zephaniah's prophecy that our Savior is indeed in our midst, and He comes to us in the sacrament of reconciliation to restore our relationship with the Father. Through this sacrament of mercy, Jesus turns away our enemy (sin) and removes his judgment against us. O Come Let Us Adore Him

In its 3rd Joyful Mystery, the Holy Rosary finds us meditating on Mary's child wrapped in swaddling clothes laid in a manger, a nativity with no room at the inn.

Across the ages, that manger setting of our Savior has become what Pope Francis describes as

"The place where the mystery of Christmas 'loves to hide.' Awe and wonder are the two feelings that move everyone young and old before the Nativity scene, which is like a living Gospel ...an unspeakable joy."

Q: What are some of the circumstances of the roots of the representative manger scene or crèche?

A: Sources state that a crèche is the same thing as a nativity scene:

"Crèche is a French word that also refers to a nursery or daycare center. Scripture accounts use the word "manger." Originally applying to just the baby Jesus, the word crèche now refers to the entire three-dimensional representation of the nativity setting."


Pope Francis spoke on the occasion marking the 800th anniversary of St. Francis of Assisi who is credited with putting together the first Christmas crèche in a cave in Italy in 1223. The Holy Father said that the Nativity scene "echoes the beauty of our faith."

Pope Benedict wrote:

"The crèche is a way to immerse oneself in God's presence..."

Luke 2 and Catechism #525 beautifully summarize the essence of that midnight clear and the lowly and magnificent nativity scene found under the star shining at the birth in Bethlehem:

"In this poverty heaven's glory was made manifest."

On a bright Spring morning, a passerby once saw St. Francis of Assisi hoeing a row of beans and asked him.

"What would you be doing right now if you knew this was the last day of your earthly life?"

The Saint responded, "I'd keep hoeing this row of beans." Preparing for this world to end — whether by our death or by Jesus' glorious coming — invites us to live not in the past or the present, but deeply in the present moment.

This same point is on display in the simple advice given by the wild and eccentric John the Baptist. He speaks of the one who is to come who will baptize

"with the Holy Spirit and fire" (Luke 3:16).

Despite the bizarre awesomeness of this announcement, he tells his listeners to engage in the present moment with simple acts of justice and love as their preparation for Jesus' coming, sharing their clothes and food, eliminating greedy and underhanded practices. being content with their wages. It's so undramatic.

But how many actually did it? We don't know.

How many of us will commit ourselves to these types of humble and demanding practices in our lives?

That's what we should be doing now in our present moment, not worrying about the future.

Advent challenge: Name one way you are doing the bare minimum towards others in your daily life. Or name something you are doing because you are not content with your financial situation.

Pray: "Jesus, if it is your will, help me to stop doing these things this week. Help me prepare for your coming."

Then make the appropriate changes.


