1. HEAR

Grab your Bible and look up today's Gospel reading. If you don't have a Bible available, you can find the ridings HERE

As an alternative to reading the Gospel, you can watch a short video with the proclamation for adults by clicking <u>HERE</u>.

The children can also watch a video proclamation of the Gospel by clicking <u>HERE</u>.

2. PRAY

In this week's Gospel, John the Baptist was in the desert preaching a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sin. Various groups of people who had gone out to hear John



preach ask him, "What should we do?" When they hear John's answers, they wonder if he is the Messiah they had been expecting. John assures them he is not the Messiah, but that the Messiah is coming.

On this Third Sunday of Advent, we too are waiting expectantly for the coming of the Messiah. Slowly read the Gospel again.

After reading the Gospel, ask Jesus what you should do during these final weeks of Advent to prepare for his coming. Listen for Jesus to respond. Talk with Jesus about what he is inviting you to do.

When you are ready, close your prayer by praying: Glory be ...

3. TALK

Family Conversation:

Tell your family what you talked with Jesus about. Share what He told you and what you think He wants you to do these last weeks of Advent.

Personal Activity:

We recently celebrated the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe. Like St. Juan Diego, you could be a messenger of love. Make a list of the important people in your life. Contact them this week (by phone, text, email, etc.) to tell them that they are important to you and that you are praying for them. (Be sure you



do actually pray for them, too!)
