Pastor's Letter

Dear Beautiful Children of God,

On the Second Sunday in Ordinary Time, Jesus begins his ministry with his "first sign," the changing of water into wine at the wedding feast in Cana. This first sign has a two-fold purpose, to remind the faithful of the sacred gift of marriage and to prepare the faithful for the heavenly banquet.

Just like the story of the Wedding Feast at Cana in the Gospel of John, the Sacrament of Matrimony has a two-fold design. Trent Horn of Catholic Answers provides a great definition of marriage as "the lifelong union of man and woman ordered to their good and the good of the children they create." The Catholic Church understands marriage through two fundamental principles.

One, marriage is unitive, meaning it is a lifelong/ permanent union between one man and one woman.

Two, marriage is procreative and requires that the married couple be open to the gift of life. The man and woman make a full gift of self to each other which has the potential to bring forth the gift of life.

The primary vocation in family life is the love between spouses, which serves as a witness of love and provides a nurturing and safe environment for their children. If we define love as seeking the good of the other, then the love of spouses and family should seek the ultimate good for one another, eternal life with God. The husband's responsibility is to get his wife to heaven and the wife's responsibility is to get her husband to heaven, and together, to bring their children to heaven with them. Together, we journey toward the heavenly banquet foretold in the Wedding Feast at Cana.

May the Good Lord continue to bless your families and fill your homes with His love.



Walking Humbly

Q: As "Pilgrims Of Hope" in this Jubilee Year how can we as wayfarers on a spiritual journey offer meditative prayer about the essential, merciful love of Jesus?

A: We can walk along the Way of the Cross. It is said that the Stations of the Cross offer: "Strength in times of suffering; instill in us compassion for those who suffer; remind us of the love of God; enable us to feel Jesus' suffering; and give us a sign of great hope," which all pilgrims seek with faithful hearts.

A St. James parishioner found the Church empty on a weekday just after an 8am Mass. Praying at each of the 14 stations, he meditated on Father Matt's reminder about the merciful indulgences of praying the Stations. He also prayed about his own family, and those affected by the wildfires, all these prayers as part of a New Year's resolve to walk more humbly with God. He prayed the wondrous prayers of love, embedded at each station:

"Out of love for you, Jesus, I will make a new attempt to accept my crosses..."

"Because by your holy cross, you have redeemed the world."

Jesus, help me see your image in all the people I meet." "Never let us, your pilgrim people, grow weary of trying to follow in your footsteps."

The parishioner, moved by the events along the Via Dolorosa, thought about the abiding hope and love of God, and that day on Calvary when the Savior promised paradise to a thief who repented.

He prayed another prayer of the way of the cross: "Jesus, I fall. I fail. I will accept my weakness and try again."

Gospel Meditation — Father John Muir

A friend invited me to an invitation-only wine-tasting event. There were over two hundred varieties of wine. Having no idea how to approach such a massive selection, I wandered aimlessly among the tables, sipping this and that. At the end of the evening my friend asked if I had tried some of the exceptionally expensive wines. I hadn't. "The really good stuff disappears first," he said. "My man, you missed out on some amazing vino." I was so disappointed. I wasted my chance for amazing once-in-a-lifetime wine. The wine I tasted was, well, *blah.*


Don't we often feel a similar disappointment in life? I missed this or that opportunity. If only I had known. Optimism sputters and fades. The glory days are gone. The chances, it seems, for the really great things in life come and go so quickly. Then they are gone forever. The good stuff goes first. Then life is just *blah*.

Not so with the Lord Jesus. In Jesus' miracle at the wedding at Cana, the steward of the feast says, **"Everyone serves good wine first, and then...** an inferior one" (John 2:10). That's the natural downward progression of life. The good stuff disappears quickly. But he says of the groom (who symbolizes Jesus), **"But you have kept the good wine until now."** This is the ever-improving trajectory of the realm of God's grace. With Jesus, the "good wine" of divine love, hope and peace gets better as our journey of faith progresses. Where are your greatest disappointments? Don't give in to the lie that the really good stuff is gone. Tell Jesus you've run out. Then learn how to taste *that* amazingly good wine, because he saves the best until now.
