## Pastor's Letter

Hello Beautiful Children of God!

At the beginning of Ordinary Time near the beginning of the new Liturgical Year, Luke describes the beginning of Jesus' public ministry. In our Gospel selection, Jesus opens his ministry with the proclamation of Isaiah 62:

> The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to bring glad tidings to the poor.

He has sent me to proclaim liberty to captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free, and to proclaim a year acceptable to the Lord.

The Jewish people would have called this acceptable year a Jubilee Year. There are three keys elements to a Jubilee Year:

release of debts. release of slaves. and return of land.

This promise can be most clearly seen through the lens of the Exodus from Egypt. God released the Israelites from the debt of sin as their hearts turned back to Him.

Then. God freed them from slavery to Egypt through the obedience of Moses and Aaron. Finally, God led His people into the promised land "flowing with milk and honey," the territory known as Israel.

The Jewish people celebrated this exodus to freedom every 50 years with a Jubilee Year by honoring these three fundamental elements of the Exodus.

As Jesus reads the passage from Isaiah 62, he proclaims his own "year acceptable to the Lord." His mission of jubilee will free those who believe in him from the debt of sin, thus releasing us from the slavery of sin (Romans 7 & 8).

But what land will Jesus return to his disciples?

"This day, you will be with me in paradise." (Luke 23:43)

Jesus proclaims that he came to free us from the slavery of sin that we might spend eternity with him in the heavenly kingdom.

THIS is the Good News of the Gospel!

THIS is our source of hope!

My dear friends, let us make this Jubilee of Hope 2025 a year acceptable to the Lord. Let us turn our hearts back to Him in repentance that He may free us from the slavery of sin to prepare for His coming into our hearts.



# Saint Blaise Blessing of the Throats Mon., Feb. 3<sup>rd</sup> at the 8am and noon Masses

Prayer to St. Blaise

I promise you, St Blaise, that the words coming from my mouth will always speak: The truth and not lies; justice and not calumnies; goodness and not harshness; comprehension and not Intransigence; forgiveness and not condemnation; pardon and not accusation; respect and not disparagement. Conciliation and not intrigue; calmness and not irritation; unselfishness and not egotism; edification and not scandal; enthusiasm and not defeatism; conformity and not complaint; love and not hate; joyfulness and not sadness; faith and not disbelief; hope and not despair. St Blaise, keep my throat free from illness so that I can praise God, my Creator, and thank you, my protector.

Blaise was named bishop of Sebaste, Armenia, and very popular among his contemporaries for performing numerous miraculous healings. He lived as a hermit even after being named bishop, converting the cave in which he lived — located in the forest of Mount Argeus — into his episcopal see.

Tradition has it that one day Bishop Blaise saved a child who had choked on a fish bone — hence the ancient custom of blessing the throats of his devotees on his feast day. That same fact also made him the patron saint of otorhinolaryngologists and those who suffer from throat ailments.

Other stories speak of Blaise's love for animals, whom he also cured. According to an ancient medieval tale, sick or injured animals came to his cave on Mount Argeus to be cured and in return, they did not harm him or bother him when he prayed.

Blaise's life and ministry ended when Agricola, governor of Cappadocia, initiated one of the last persecutions against Christians. When a group of his hunters went to look for animals in the forest of Argeus for some "games," they found many of them grouped outside the cave of St. Blaise. The saint was praying at the time and was taken prisoner.

Placed in the presence of Agricola, he was told to renounce the Christian faith, but he flatly refused the proposal. He was immediately locked up in a dungeon, where he remained for some days preaching among the captives and those condemned to death. There, he also cured the sick and baptized those who wanted to become Christians.

According to the Acts of St. Blaise, the hermit bishop was condemned to die by drowning but, when he was thrown into the waters, he began to walk on them, as Jesus Christ himself once did. He was then led to the scaffold, tortured, and finally beheaded. He died a martyr in 316 A.D., in the time of the Roman emperor Licinius.

## Walking Humbly

Q: As "Pilgrims Of Hope" in this Jubilee Year how can we as wayfarers on a spiritual journey offer meditative prayer about the essential, merciful love of Jesus?

A: We can walk along the Way of the Cross. It is said that the Stations of the Cross offer: "Strength in times of suffering; instill in us compassion for those who suffer; remind us of the love of God; enable us to feel Jesus' suffering; and give us a sign of great hope," which all pilgrims seek with faithful hearts.

A parishioner found the Church empty on a weekday just after an 8am Mass. Praying at each of the 14 stations, he meditated on Father Matt's reminder about the merciful indulgences of praying the Stations. He also prayed about his own family, and those affected by the wildfires, all these prayers as part of a New Year's resolve to walk more humbly with God. He prayed the wondrous prayers of love, embedded at each station:

"Out of love for you, Jesus, I will make a new attempt to accept my crosses..." "Because by your holy cross. you have redeemed the world." Jesus, help me see your image in all the people I meet." "Never let us, your pilgrim people, grow weary of trying to follow in your footsteps."

The parishioner, moved by the events along the Via Dolorosa, thought about the abiding hope and love of God, and that day on Calvary when the Savior promised paradise to a thief who repented.

He prayed another prayer of the way of the cross: "Jesus. I fall. I fail. I will accept my weakness and try again."

## Gospel Meditation — Father John Muir OLPI

A young couple in my parish told me they were expecting their second child, a baby boy. I knew that their five-year old only child Emma had been desperately wanting to be a big sister for years, so I said, "Emma must have been so happy when you told her the news." "Actually," they said, "she burst into tears. She wanted a baby sister!"

How often in life God wonderfully fulfills our desires and we are sad because we don't approve of the way he does it. We want to control the gift and the delivery method.

The same thing occurs in the Gospel this week when Jesus announces in his hometown that the promise of an Anointed One bringing glad tidings to the poor is "fulfilled in your hearing" (Luke 4:21).

After a moment of elation, his fellow townsfolk realize this man is the way God is fulfilling his promises. and they erupt into a violent outburst. So Jesus departs. How sad for them.

Every single Sunday at Mass, including this one, some version of this happens to many of us.

God's word announces the fulfillment of God's promises in Christ, and we easily overlook or disdain it. His way is almost never according to our narrow expectations.

What's required of us is to set these aside, and to embrace a new openness to God's gifts, no matter how he wishes to give them.

God is fulfilling his promises the way He likes why be sad?
