Saint Blaise Blessing of the Throats Mon., Feb. 3rd at the 8am and noon Masses

Prayer to St. Blaise

I promise you, St Blaise, that the words coming from my mouth will always speak: The truth and not lies; justice and not calumnies; goodness and not harshness; comprehension and not Intransigence; forgiveness and not condemnation; pardon and not accusation; respect and not disparagement. Conciliation and not intrigue; calmness and not irritation; unselfishness and not egotism; edification and not scandal; enthusiasm and not defeatism; conformity and not complaint; love and not hate; joyfulness and not sadness; faith and not disbelief; hope and not despair. St Blaise, keep my throat free from illness so that I can praise God, my Creator, and thank you, my protector. Amen.

Blaise was named bishop of Sebaste, Armenia, and very popular among his contemporaries for performing numerous miraculous healings. He lived as a hermit even after being named bishop, converting the cave in which he lived — located in the forest of Mount Argeus — into his episcopal see.

Tradition has it that one day Bishop Blaise saved a child who had choked on a fish bone — hence the ancient custom of blessing the throats of his devotees on his feast day. That same fact also made him the patron saint of otorhinolaryngologists and those who suffer from throat ailments.

Other stories speak of Blaise's love for animals, whom he also cured. According to an ancient medieval tale, sick or injured animals came to his cave on Mount Argeus to be cured and in return, they did not harm him or bother him when he prayed.

Blaise's life and ministry ended when Agricola, governor of Cappadocia, initiated one of the last persecutions against Christians. When a group of his hunters went to look for animals in the forest of Argeus for some "games," they found many of them grouped outside the cave of St. Blaise. The saint was praying at the time and was taken prisoner.

Placed in the presence of Agricola, he was told to renounce the Christian faith, but he flatly refused the proposal. He was immediately locked up in a dungeon, where he remained for some days preaching among the captives and those condemned to death. There, he also cured the sick and baptized those who wanted to become Christians.

According to the Acts of St. Blaise, the hermit bishop was condemned to die by drowning but, when he was thrown into the waters, he began to walk on them, as Jesus Christ himself once did. He was then led to the scaffold, tortured, and finally beheaded. He died a martyr in 316 A.D., in the time of the Roman emperor Licinius.

Catholic Q & A J.P. Alegria

Sound Words

January 26th marked the Feast Day of first century evangelist, Bishop and martyr - *St. Timothy.*

Q: What sage advice did St. Paul have for Timothy?

A: Among the *Lives of the Saints*, Reverend Alban Butler relates Paul's personal instructions to his protégé, Timothy:

"Hold to the form of sound words... Attende lectioni - apply thyself to reading."

Celebrating the Sunday of the Word of God, *Vatican News* reports that Pope Francis urged all Christians to carry a pocket Bible and read a few verses everyday.

St. Augustine wrote, "He who wishes often to be with God ought to pray frequently and read pious books."

The United States Conference Of Catholic Bishops designates spiritual reading, especially the Gospels as an important form of meditation. This spiritual reading is traditionally called *lectio divina* or *divine reading*. The Bishops recommend, as part of this *lectio*, to apply the following methodology with holy scripture:

- 1. **Read** a short passage from the Bible carefully, perhaps three or four times, letting it soak in.
- 2. **Meditate** on what you've read. Imagine the setting, "see" the people and the unfolding action.
- 3. **Prayer** is the next element, asking for graces, offering praise and thanksgiving and seeking forgiveness.
- 4. **Contemplation**, which the Bishops describe as "a gaze turned toward Christ and the things of God."

In augmenting our lectio, there are any number of potential reading lists we could construct to attend to what Paul called "sound words and holy reading."

A suggested list of these could include:

On the Consecrated Life, by Pope John Paul II The Catechism of the Catholic Church The Story of a Soul by St. Therese Confessions by St. Augustine The Book of Pastoral Rule by Pope St. Gregory the Great Butler's Lives of the Saints by Rev. Alban Butler

The Art of Living by Dr.Sri, the virtuous book St. James parishioners were gifted can also help to, as the Bishops said

"...turn our gaze toward Jesus and the things of God."

Gospel Meditation — Father John Muir

What is the secret to sharing in God's power to overcome our difficulties?

Mary teaches us this in the prophecy of her pierced heart. This Sunday, the old man Simeon prophecies that when her son faces opposition, Mary's soul will be pierced by a sword. The seemingly pointless agony of a mother helplessly watching her son be mocked, tortured, killed and then cruelly desecrated in death by a spear somehow this piercing of her heart releases a power by which

"the thoughts of many hearts may be revealed"

(Luke 2:35). What to make of this?

Whatever problems we currently face, the deepest threat is finally that evil thoughts are hidden in the human heart: hatred, envy, pride, lust, greed and so on.

Behind every tyrant's injustice, for example, is a heart unpierced by love. Evil hides in our hearts. Mary's pierced heart, and its suffering love for her son, reveals and scatters these evil thoughts, and replaces them with love, forgiveness, generosity and peace.

This week, I invite us to ponder Mary's pierced heart.

Her heart is quietly at work for us in the Church and world, exposing our evil thoughts and making a path for her son's divine love.


This is how she gently cooperates in our salvation.

Closed hearts are our biggest problem; love-pierced hearts are the ultimate power to overcome every difficulty.
