PASTOR'S CORNER

Hello beautiful children of God!

The 7th Sunday of Ordinary Time presents one of the most demanding commands from Jesus – “love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you, pray for those who mistreat you.” (Luke 6:27b-28) Our response is usually “that’s easy for you to say, Jesus. You have no idea what this person did to me!” I think He does. One gaze upon the Holy Cross will remind us of the prayer Jesus prayed as he hung upon the rugged cross. “Father, forgive them for they know not what they do.” (Luke 23:34) Our Lord would never ask us to do something that he himself would not. Most importantly, he doesn’t ask us to go it alone. His grace is always at work in us.

One of the most important lessons for me as I continue this journey of faith is that it’s easy to return hate for hate, but truly transformational to return prayers as an answer to hatred. We can look at the response of St Maximilian Kolbe as a grace-filled example of this.

Kolbe was imprisoned at the Auschwitz death camp during World War II. One of the camp prisoners escaped, and as a result, 10 men were chosen for execution to dissuade others from attempting an escape. One of the chosen men cried out for mercy because he had a wife and children when Fr Maximilian stepped forward to take his place. The ten were led forward to a starvation bunker in Block 11. Fr Kolbe led the ten in prayer and songs of praise as they awaited the end. Fr Kolbe and his ten companions prayed for their persecutors even in the direst of situations.

God blesses us with examples like St Maximilian Kolbe and other countless martyrs to remind us that, through Him, we do have the strength to endure the worst situations imaginable with his grace. Let us put our trust in the Lord, that He can take evil and bring forth goodness if only we love our enemies in prayer.

IT'S TIME

It's the longest season in the Church's liturgical year. It's a time that celebrates Jesus' ministry.

Church leadership describes it as a time to reflect on how we live as Christians; a time for growth, maturation and personal holiness. It's characterized as a time to delve more deeply into scripture, (currently the Gospel of Matthew,) and to unite more fully with the Lord in the Eucharist.

Q: What time is it?

A: It's Ordinary Time!

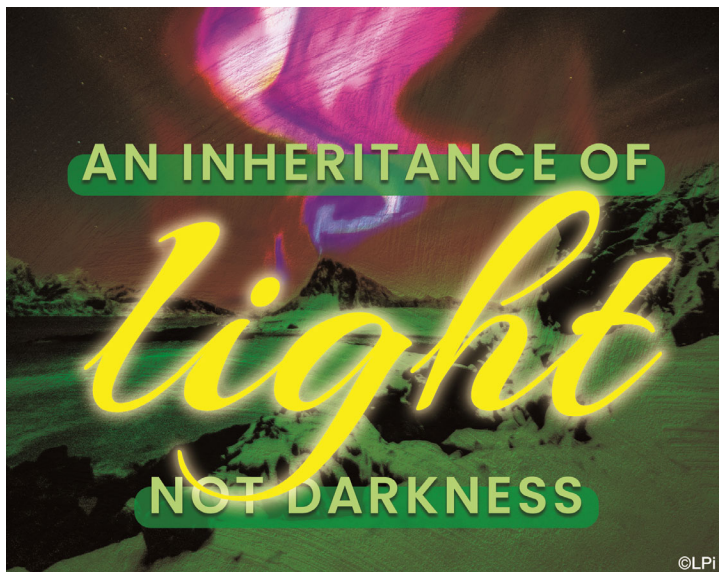
The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops call it a time of conversion: "This is living the life of Christ. The goal, toward which all of history is directed, is represented by the final Sunday in Ordinary Time, the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe."

U.S. Catholic writes about the 33 weeks of Ordinary Time: "The ordinary in Ordinary Time does not refer to a season of dull routine, but rather the listing of ordinal. or sequential, numbers...the order of Sundays in the Church year that do not fall into the major liturgical seasons of Advent, Christmas, Lent, or Easter."

As we celebrate each week in ordinary time we can be aware that the green colored vestments of the Priest are said to represent growth and renewal. Speaking of growth and renewal, Pope Francis said that as we enter the Sundays of Ordinary Time, we can ask:

"How is my today? ...let it assist us in walking with Jesus Christ, evaluating our lives, slowing our pace, and seeking God and our neighbor with greater sincerity."

This is the time for that kind of spiritual ordering of our lives.



GOSPEL MEDITATION

One of my favorite new singers/songwriters is Noah Kahan. I'm a little biased because, like me, he is originally from Vermont. In a fine song entitled "Stick Season," he sings of his hope to "cancel out the darkness I inherited from dad." This lyric articulates his painful recognition of a dark spiritual "inheritance" from his father, and his hope to be free of it. We all inherit some degree of evil from our earthly forebears. It's easy to feel doomed to repeat their darknesses.

But we're not so doomed, thank God. This week's Gospel proclaims this. Whatever good or bad we received from our parents, we have a more definitive and perfect inheritance in God. Jesus commands us, **"Be merciful just as your Father is merciful"** (Luke 6:36). We have a perfect Father in heaven and are destined to inherit and reflect that perfect and merciful love. We have an inheritance of light, not darkness, and thus a whole new possibility of magnanimous love. Like any inheritance, this is a free gift to us.

What are we destined to repeat? Not the darkness of our earthly parents. We are destined to be a reflection of God's life. Jesus liberates us from the inevitability of repeating whatever evils and imperfections are in our familial or cultural upbringings. It's time to claim that perfect inheritance. - **Father John Muir** ©LPI

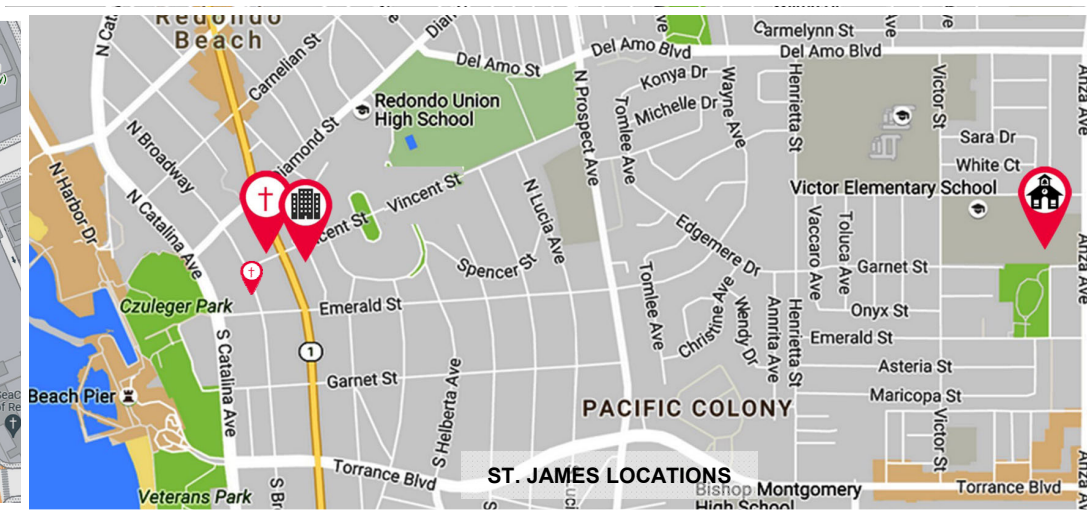
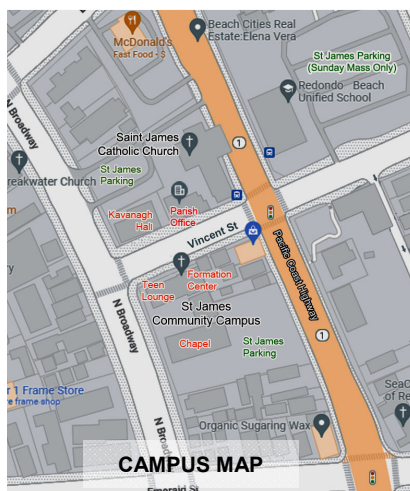
