PASTOR'S CORNER

Hello beautiful children of God!

On this Second Sunday of Lent (Year C), we hear the story of the Transfiguration from the Gospel of Luke. Jesus takes his "inner circle" (Peter, James, and John) up Mount Tabor where he reveals his divine nature to the disciples and so unveils the glory of the kingdom to come. Appearing on either side of Jesus are Elijah and Moses, representing the prophets and the law of the Israelite people. These two Old Testament figures longed to look on the face of God, as so their deepest longing is fulfilled as they gaze upon the face of Jesus and testify to His divinity.

We hear at the completion of this Gospel passage that a voice came from heaven, saying "this is my chosen Son, listen to him." This command once again evokes the prophets and law; "here is...my chosen" (Isa 42:1 – Prophets) and "to him you shall listen." (Deut 18:15 – Torah). The scene of the Transfiguration leaves no doubt that Jesus is the Son of God, and his disciples would soon realize the meaning of this remarkable revelation, that we too would share in his glory. There is no doubt that this revelation inspired the Apostles to preach the Gospel truth as they built up the Body of Christ on earth.

This Gospel invites us to listen to the voice of God in our own hearts. Take time each day to encounter Him in the silence so that the still, small voice of our Lord can direct our wavering hearts. I pray that you will find rest in Him during this season of intense prayer.

PROPERTY UPDATE: The appeal period has ended without opposition, so the property at 124 N. PCH is now sold. Once the sale closes, we'll pay off the loan on the Community Campus and make plans for our future parish center on that property. I will keep the community updated as we proceed forward. She went on to become a special education teacher and administrator for the Los Angeles Unified School District, a career that spanned more than three decades. Her consistent support of the parish included helping run the food booths for the Harvest Festival and volunteering at St James School while her daughter Nicole attended. Jean's contributions to the parish have included, in recent years, being a Board Member of the St James School Education Foundation. She, along with the rest of the Board take an active interest in continuing and supporting the excellent educational activities at the school. You can find her still at the Harvest Festival selling tickets for the "beverage cart" and helping out wherever she can. She is the kind of volunteer that just gets the work done and doesn't care who gets the credit. In fact, her family reports that she is a little embarrassed by all of this since she would rather stay in the background and just "do the work".

Jean and her husband Don still live in Torrance and she is very proud of her daughter Nicole, another St James graduate, as well as her step sons Devin, his wife Karly, Andrew and Zachary (and, her true favorite, "Mojo" the dog).

Jean is the person you want to have on your team, she just gets the job done with a smile and love!





CATHOLIC Q & A

J.P. ALEGRIA

LENT: DEUS IBI EST

After an examination of conscience, a penitent confessed about a week in which loving one's neighbor by being non-judgemental had been a commitment, unmet.

Q: Father, how can one more faithfully internalize and put into practice the moral imperative reflected in those passages in the Holy Bible from Matthew, Luke, and John, when Jesus says to his disciples:

"Judge not, lest ye be judged?"

A: The Priest responded in terms of the practical, merciful, and wholly charitable means of recognizing the face of Jesus in one another. Similarly, in an Angelus Address in 2021 Pope Francis said:

"Let us ask for the grace to overcome temptation to judge and to categorize. Christians must be on guard and avoid the temptation of thinking themselves better than others, an attitude that risks turning the church into a place of separation and not communion. Pray for others instead of judging them."

Pope John Paul II taught that "People should not judge others based on their sins, but instead recognize them as children of God...Try to understand others' words and actions in a positive way."

An antiphonal response in the Roman Missal seems to underscore the charitable, non-judgmental heart:

"Ubi caritas est vera. Deus ibi est." From Latin to English: "Where true charity is, God is there."

Finally, consider these words about judging: "Instead of putting others in their place, put yourself in their place."
