PASTOR'S CORNER

Hello beautiful children of God!

As we journey deeper into this sacred season of Lent, the Gospel reading for this Third Sunday invites us to reflect on the theme of *spiritual thirst* and our longing for God's living water. The story of the woman at the well (John 4:5-42) is one that speaks profoundly to each of us, especially during this time of renewal.

In the encounter between Jesus and the Samaritan woman, we see not just a conversation, but an invitation. Jesus, sitting at the well, asks for a drink of water—something so simple, yet deeply significant. At first, the woman is confused. How can a Jewish man, whose people traditionally despise Samaritans, ask her for water? But Jesus, as always, uses the moment to turn her expectations upside down. He offers her something far greater than she could have imagined: "Everyone who drinks this water will be thirsty again, but whoever drinks the water I give will never thirst" (John 4:13).

This offer of living water is not just a promise of physical satisfaction, but a promise that our deepest spiritual thirst—the thirst for love, truth, and belonging—will be quenched in Him. Throughout Lent, we are called to reflect on the ways we try to fill that thirst with things that ultimately leave us wanting. The Samaritan woman tried to quench her thirst with relationships and worldly distractions, but only Jesus could offer what her heart truly needed.

As we walk with Jesus this Lent, let us reflect on our own thirsts. What are the things we turn to in our lives that leave us empty? In our world today, there are many ways we try to fill our hearts—through accomplishments, material things, or even temporary pleasures. But none of these will ever truly satisfy us. Only Jesus, the Living Water, can fill the deepest longing of our souls.

Jesus' conversation with the Samaritan woman is a reminder that He meets us where we are, no matter our past or our struggles. He doesn't judge her for her brokenness; instead, He offers her grace and the possibility of a new life. Just like the woman at the well, we too are invited to open our hearts to Jesus and let Him satisfy our thirst for the eternal, for the life-giving water that only He can provide.

THROUGH BOTH TRIAL AND JOY

Our Choir sings a composition of praise called "At The Name Of Jesus." With a Gospel style, and familiar refrain, the words of this song echo across the ages with lyrics based on a letter from Paul to the Philipians:

"At the name of Jesus, every knee shall bow..."

Along this action of faith, Father Matt reminds us that prayer is one of the intentional spiritual practices of Lent.

Q: How does the Church define prayer?

A: The Catechism of the Catholic Church, (which Pope John Paul II called, "A sure norm for teaching the Faith.") devotes its entire fourth section to prayer, with more than 300 citations on the subject. Here we read about the necessity of prayer; its nature; its importance in catechesis; the various forms of prayer; the ways of prayer such as contemplative, meditative, vocal; prayers of discernment, forgiveness, adoration, blessing, or as a request; the Lord's Prayer; and many other insights into prayer.

The U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops in describing prayer and worship give us the words of St. Therese:

"For me, prayer is a surge of the heart; it is a simple look toward heaven, it is a cry of recognition and of love, embracing both trial and joy."

St. John Damascene is quoted by the Bishops, offering his frequently cited, classic definition:

"Prayer is the raising of one's mind and heart to God..."

Lent. A season of prayer...intentional spiritual practice...a look toward heaven...every knee shall bow.

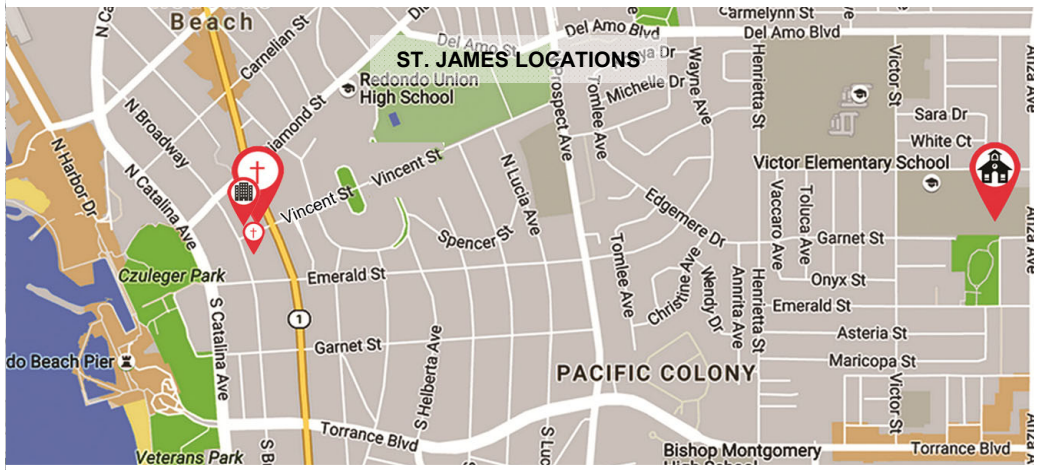
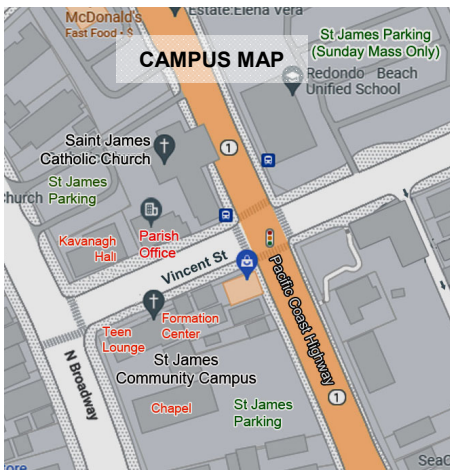
